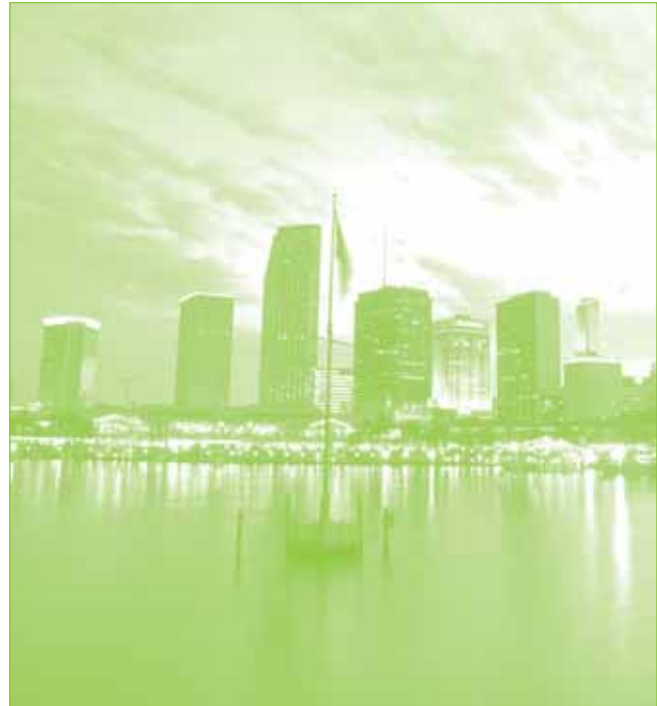

How to Design a Mixed Methods Study

*Presenters: John W. Creswell, Ph.D. University of Nebraska-Lincoln
Ron Shope, Ph.D. University of Nebraska-Lincoln and Grace University*

The intent of this interactive workshop is to learn the steps in designing a mixed methods study and to practice the steps by writing a plan for a group study. Mixed methods research is a design for collecting, analyzing, and mixing both quantitative and qualitative data in a single study or a series of studies. To implement this definition, workshop participants will go through steps such as identifying a research problem and question, specifying the types of quantitative and qualitative data to collection, considering the reasons for mixing, specifying the type of mixed methods design suitable for their research problem, learning how to visually depict their type of design, and understanding the basic of data analysis within the types of designs. Emphasis will be placed on four distinct types of mixed methods designs. During the workshop, participants will write out the components of a group design and individuals with mixed methods projects in mind can write out their projects. At the end, the group and individual projects will be shared with all participants.

Conducting Systematic Reviews

*Presenters: Betsey J. Becker, Michigan State University
Julia Littell, Bryn Mawr College
Teresa Piggott, Loyola University Chicago*

Participants will learn how to conduct rigorous systematic reviews of empirical evidence that can inform stakeholders about the effects of social interventions. The workshop provides information, guidelines, and practical tools for planning and conducting systematic reviews, following standards developed by the international, interdisciplinary Campbell Collaboration and the Cochrane Collaboration. Topics include problem formulation and the scope of systematic reviews, protocol development, setting inclusion and exclusion criteria, information retrieval strategies, study eligibility decisions, data extraction, assessment of study quality, narrative summaries of studies and their results, quantitative synthesis and meta-analysis, and incorporation of qualitative data on implementation and intervention processes in systematic reviews.

12:30 – 4:00 **Half-Day Workshop**

Using NVIVO in Qualitative Research

Presenter: Sarah Morgan, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee

Workshop participants will be introduced to the major components and functions of NVIVO software for qualitative data management and analysis. This will be a hands-on interactive workshop and therefore will be limited to twenty participants. The workshop will cover such topics as when and how to use NVIVO, creating projects, working with documents, coding your data, and managing the results. Participants will have the opportunity to work with an actual dataset, providing a hands-on experience as each new concept is introduced. This session will be geared toward those persons with little to no prior experience with NVIVO. Participants will need to bring their own laptop computer to use during the session.
